- A. <u>Trooper Report</u> TFC Shaun Tucker submitted statistics collected between the dates of 01/01/2023 and 01/31/2023. See attached report.
- B. <u>Board Members Reports:</u> None
- Board of Finance Discussion: D Weingart, Chair of the Board of Finance, C. reported that the final stages of the audit are under way. Auditor set to attend the Board of Finance Special Meeting on 02/06/2023. Also reported that the Budget process is underway with proposals due back on 02/09/2023. The Board of Selectmen are scheduled to present their budget proposal to the Board of Finance on 03/13/2023. 6. New Business

- A. <u>American Rescue Plan Funds</u>: J Roman reported that a design for the new HVAC system at the Firehouse is in process and that the installation of the new HVAC System for the Senior Center/Library has been delayed to a start date in June 2023.
- B. All Pending and New FOI Requests: Covanta requested numbers for solid waste collection and disposal. Responded and closed 1/11/2023; American Transparency requested electronic copy of all employees for the year of 2022 and gross annual wages. Responded on 1/17/2023; The Connecticut Cemetery Association requested names and addresses of all Chaplin cemeteries and person in charge. Responded and closed 1/24/2023; Rescue Funds Allies Team requested list of overage monies held as a result of foreclosure. Responded 1/17/2023; Kristine Cormier requested info regarding our animal control program. Forwarded to NECCOG on 1/24/2023. Jacqueline Rabe Thomas, Investigative Reporter requested info pertaining exit and retirement agreements with our municipal police department. Responded and closed on 1/30/2023.

C. <u>Discussion of New Emergency Radio System:</u> J Pinto reported that the grant application has been submitted.

- Discussion of Emergency Service TV Monitor: J Roman reported that a 70" screen on a stand with wheels was obtained by Alex Hill from UConn Surplus equipment which will allow the screen to be moved and stored when not in use. This tv monitor has many of the abilities of a smart board and will also be useful for emergency training.
- E. <u>Discussion of the Regulations for the Use of the Joseph Ferrara</u>

 <u>Community Room:</u> J Roman stated that new regulations for the rental of the Community room have been drafted, reviewed and approved at the BOS Special Meeting on January 30, 2023. The new regulations mirror the

- Fire Department Hall Rental Regulations however do not include any regulations pertaining to the use of the kitchen which will not be available to Community Room rentals.
- F. <u>Discussion and Possible Action for the Purchase of Hurst Battery Powered Rescue Tools for the New Firetruck:</u> J Pinto submitted a Request for Bids which he has asked to be published. Specifications for the emergency equipment were also submitted and will be available to bidders.
- G. <u>USDA Grant-Purchase of a New Fire Truck:</u> Susan Welshman is currently working with Tricia Anderson, Grant Coordinator, and Val Garrison, Finance Manager, on the finalization of request for re-imbursement.
- H. <u>Discuss Updates on Bedlam Bridge and England Road Bridge:</u> A request for proposals for engineering services was sent out to various engineers and published in the Hartford Courant. A pre-bid conference with interested engineers is scheduled for 02/14/2023 at 2;30 pm.
- I. <u>Discuss Electronic Sign Re-imbursement status: Re-imbursement has progressed to the fiscal department for processing.</u> J Roman reported speaking with Attorney Kim Zigich from the CT DESPP in which she stated that the Town of Chaplin's request for re-imbursement has been flagged as high priority but that due to severe under-staffing issues, the process has been delayed. She has promised to keep Juan informed.
