Artists of the Month


Janice Leitch

I REMEMBER FUN

That's right! i may be old and decrepit now but by golly, I remember fun. Sure I remember a few things from when I was a child, like playing with the kittens in the barn, riding old Nellie back to the barn, helping churn the butter. Yes, I'm that old. I didn't have a playmate till I was in school. We lived on a farm pretty much without neighbors so no children around. We had to make our own fun. I remember hopscotch. In later years I remember as teenagers the fun we had with swimming parties in the summer and ice-skating parties in the winter and sock hops at school. I remember roller skating every Friday night and bowling now and then. I remember drive-in movies. I remember sitting by the water reading a book. I remember fishing contests that I always won. That was fun. I remember rolling down a hill and not being to dizzy to stand up. I remember badminton. I remember waterskling on the lake and the ocean, which made me seasick, but that was fun. But, right now I'm talking about fun as an adult. I remember all the camping trips and taking the kids to special kids' places in the summer. That was fun. Later on 1 remember what fun it was to take the snowmobiles off to wherever there was snow. We would be outside for hours in freezing cold dressed like a snowman. Even that was fun. It was the same idea in the summer only that was riding motorcycles every chance we got. That was really fun. I remember waiting for the kids to go to school so my neighborhood girl friends and I could get together and drink coffee while we played silly games like using the Ouija board and scaring ourselves to death. 
