This has increased confidence in the students and increased the number of students that choose to take the honors 8<sup>th</sup> grade math course. These 8<sup>th</sup> graders then take one semester of standard 8<sup>th</sup> grade math and one semester of honors. This helps students to be prepared for the SBAC test.

-8<sup>th</sup> graders also participate in one quarter rotation of computer science

- High school students have several math classes to choose from, one of the newest options for students is a class that involves one semester of algebra 2, and one semester of intro to statistics. This prepares students for the SAT, as well as AP Statistics should they choose to take it.

-Clubs include Math Modeling Club (using Statistics and Calculus) and Cyberstart America, which introduces students to cyber security and students are able to compete on a national level to move up on the leaderboards.

-Project STEM gives our school curriculum 7-12 as well as speakers and virtual fieldtrips relating to computer sciences, with hands-on real-world examples.

-Aspirations and Computing gives scholarships for computer science training.

- AP Computer Science class is growing, last year all students got a 4 or 5.

-All students passed AP Calculus and AP Statistics exams.
