**4. STUDENT REPORT:**

Cory Harrington presented the Student Report. A video study on academic integrity and the silent corner on suicide awareness has been submitted nationally. Mr. Harrington’s project is on artificial intelligence that ties into economics which is being used more and more by advertising companies and computer science that is more precise.

**7. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS/ADMINISTRATIVE REQUESTS FOR BOARD ACTION:**

**A. Principal:**

- The PTA held a Paint for a Purpose fundraiser that was very successful with 40 people in attendance.

- Midterms have begun.
- Mrs. Minski will take her World Language students on a trip to the Winter Carnival in Quebec City on February 10<sup>th</sup>.
- Mr. Jendrewski will take his World Language students on a trip to Italy/France/Spain in April.
- The Foxwoods Bingo fundraiser for the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Washington D.C. trip will be held on February 24<sup>th</sup>. Tickets are \$15.00.
- The musical production of "Annie" will be held on March 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>.
- The Empty Bowls Open Studio will begin on Saturdays through March from 10-1pm.
- The Youth Health Service Corps afterschool club will meet on Wednesdays with an opportunity to work on a community service project.

**B. Superintendent:**

- A meeting will be held on Thursday for Allied Health. An exploratory course (Allied Health I) will be available next year and Allied Health II will be available the following year.
- Upcoming U.S. Supreme Court cases regarding "Appropriate Education" decision expected in June.
- Additional lighting is needed for the driveway circle. Quotes are being obtained from Paquette and Conserv. Kate Donnelly suggested obtaining a quote from Earthlight Technologies.
- The Board was presented with a budget comparison between last year and this year. Expenditures were less this year due to new hires, vacancies (maintenance/custodian), and special education outplacement.
- New legislation focuses on student data privacy and background checks for staff.
- ECS funding was reduced due to state budget cuts (approximately \$11,000 for Chaplin, \$9,000 for Hampton, \$8,000 for Scotland).
- The Board was presented with insurance coverage in writing for 6<sup>th</sup> grade students participating in activities at Parish Hill per request from Jennifer Nelson.

**8. OLD BUSINESS/NEW BUSINESS:**

**A. Report by PTO/Parish Hill Action Community Team:**

- The PTA is officially chartered by the CT PTA.
- A half way there lunch will be held for the teachers on Thursday.
- Connect for Respect will kick-off with speaker Ken Caputo that compliments existing school culture.
- Junior Pirates Booster Club is free for grades K-6 and includes reserved seating, a badge, free admission to two games and pre-game activities with the athletes.
- Student Athletes will reach out to the elementary schools and read for Dr. Seuss Day.
- Working on Sponsor Scholarships with students to write essays with a pirate theme.
- Looking to increase membership to 100 members (currently have 45) for additional funding from the CT PTA up to \$1,500.

Grade 8/CMT Science – (84% for 2015), (78% for 2016)

Grade 10/CAPT Science – (74% for 2015), (82% for 2016)

Grade 7/SBA English Language Arts – (61% for 2015), (68% for 2016)

Grade 8/SBA English Language Arts – (53% for 2015), (68% for 2016)

Grade 11/SBA English Language Arts – (63% for 2015) replaced by SAT in 2016

Grade 7/SBA Math – (23% for 2015), (41% for 2016)

Grade 8/SBA Math – (8% for 2015), (33% for 2016)

Grade 11/SBA Math – (19% for 2015) replaced by SAT in 2016

Parish Hill ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> out of eight area high schools for 2015 SAT scores and 5<sup>th</sup> out of fourteen area schools for 2016 SAT scores.
